- Super Region Reports/Updates
 - Consortia Updates
 - North County- Working on the CIP, doing consortium Data Dialogues, Path to Palomar virtual experience on March 9
 - East County- Working on CIP, preparing for yearly summit, in a WASC self-study period, essential worker preparation classes are in-person, professional learning series wrapping up, continuing to focus on cultural responsiveness and anti-racism, starting SB-554 cohort
 - San Diego- Working on CIP, getting Bridge Program going – narrowing on target populations
 - South Bay- Partnered with Goodwill for job readiness certificate
 - MiraCosta- Focusing on enrollment and placements, which have gone up, planning to have some on-site classes in the Fall
 - Partner Updates – Workforce Partnership: feedback and input appreciated through next month, Shaina Gross is taking over region work going forward
- Discussion Item I: Strong Workforce Workgroup 1b – *Work facilitated by WestEd*
 - CTE Coding / Alignment Training
 - Updates- First train-the-trainer workshop took place yesterday, WestEd walked the team through the process of CTE coding and tier allocation
 - Next Steps- Next training is on March 4, consortia will begin coding in the meantime
- Discussion Item II: FY 20-21 Focus 1
 - Developing an equity framework across the Super Region
 - Updates
 - SD Continuing Ed had a keynote speaker, Rodney Walker, talk about mentorship models within public education
 - Escondido Adult School joined district-wide cultural proficiency committee and working on a project called “No Room for Hate”
 - Poway Adult School working with district on hearing from parents in the community and collaborating with the County Office of Ed on coaching
 - Palomar College addressing equity in Spring Plenary
 - Next Steps- efforts will continue

- Discussion Item III: FY 20-21 Focus 2
 - Developing a proposal to recommend alternatives to measure student learning gains, rather than relying on standardized testing alone
 - *On hold until coding project is complete*
- Discussion Item IV: Senate Bill 554
 - First cohort moving along at Grossmont, attracting new students to adult schools and colleges
 - Sweetwater in the early planning process
- Discussion Item V: CARES Funding – Who has access?
 - Southwestern looking into getting access to CARES funds for noncredit students
 - Sweetwater was not included
 - Grossmont had access to some of the funds, but not all
 - MiraCosta is still waiting for an answer from the college on access for noncredit students
 - Vista Adult School and Escondido Adult School received some funds in the beginning
 - San Diego Continuing Education was given funding along with the credit colleges
