- Super Region Reports/Updates
 - Consortia Updates
 - NORTH COUNTY- Closing out 19-20 for WIOA, working on one-year plan, collaborating with CALPRO on Equity Training
 - EAST COUNTY- Participating in CALPRO Equity Training, working with college partners to integrate SB 554, opening some in-person classes
 - SAN DIEGO- Starting DLAC Cohort 3, struggling with e-testing
 - SOUTH BAY- Also participating in CALPRO Equity Training, working on articulations with Southwestern College and Sweetwater, looking at Data and Transitions project results
 - MIRA COSTA- Started "NOTE" Program, tailoring online training to adult modality
 - Partner Updates: Career Centers are still virtual, looking for adult school input on how Career Centers can serve students (Melanie)

- Discussion Item I: SWP WG1b
 - Strong Workforce Workgroup 1b Update
 - Looking at WestEd's tool again "California Regional Education to Workforce Dashboard" with filtering capabilities
 - In need of a more centralized place to store Adult Ed data

Next Steps: Strong Workforce is scheduling meeting with Center of Excellence and WestEd, as well as Suzanne and Ute to discuss this further

- Discussion Item II: FY 20-21 Focus 1
 - Developing an equity framework across the Super Region
 - Updates
 - Stacey: Moodle for Equity training is open for participants involved in the project, first official meeting is on October 22
 - Ute will facilitate another session in the Spring for those who missed the first one

Next Steps: Get in touch with Ute if interested in signing up for Spring

- Discussion Item III: FY 20-21 Focus 2 – Workgroup update
 - Developing a proposal to recommend alternatives to measure student learning gains, rather than relying on standardized testing alone
 - Research what Washington State adult education is using to measure outcomes
 - Focus on alignment between CAEP and WIOA
 - Consider alignment with CCC student learning outcomes
 - Vet with other CAEP consortia
 - Present to CAEP – Chancellor’s Office & CDE

Looking into other kinds of measurable Skills Gains beyond testing, discussed testing challenges and how testing is inequitable for many students.

Next Steps: Will compare state and federal testing requirements, closer examination of Immigrant Integration Metrics, include CAEP and CDE offices in forthcoming discussions.

- Discussion Item IV: Senate Bill 554

East Region currently working on this (Ute)
