1. Discussion: AE and Noncredit workgroup (formerly Workgroup 1b) Regional SWP Consortium
  - Bea Aguilar (CC Rep) and Kim Bellaart (AE Rep)
  - Update on Data Repository (and coding project):
    - Noncredit classes have been added and a Point of Contact for each consortium has been identified for the Community of Practice
    - 1st Community of Practice meeting has been scheduled for Jan 20
  - Update on Program Finder:
    - There has been positive movement in conversations to include Adult Education and Noncredit in the Program Finder tool for the county. We will keep everyone updated on progress.
  - Early College Credit flier
    - The region created customizable Early College Credit flyers for students and counselors.
    - Creation of an ad hoc workgroup to meet and create a similar flier for Early College Credit options for Adult Ed students through SB554.

    - Will define terms and options for students.

1. Consortia and Partner Updates
  - Roundtable: General Updates
    - Kim Bellaart, Grossmont = Currently they are following the K-12 guidelines of their district. They don't have the infrastructure to require vaccination or testing, so only masks are required. The District will be getting testing kits, but it is unknown if adult education students will have access to these or only K-12.

- Liz O'Shea-West = Also following K-12 guidelines. Masks required indoors and outdoors, but no proof of vaccination needed. Students self-report if they or someone in their household are sick. If someone is sick, they're following the guideline tree. Testing kits were only provided for K-12 students, and they didn't even have enough for all of those students.
- Stacey Adame = Same as Liz and Kim. Guideline tree is confusing. No kits for adult education students.
- Jay Marquand = Funding for testing kits was through ESSER, which is only for K-12 students. Purchasing kits for adult education students would have to come out of the District's own budget. His district does have weekly testing available for students, teachers, and staff. They have been onsite since April 2021.
- Christine Jensen = Coronado is still following K-12 guidelines.
- Nora Kenney = Students have to be vaccinated and upload proof or submit for an exemption.
- Kelly, Cole, and Stacey = Proof of vaccination or exemption is required in their districts, and their districts are currently in the process of helping students upload these.
- Returning to in-person instruction:
  - Nora Kenney says students are reluctant to come back on campus.
  - Liz O'Shea-West says students don't see the need for training right now.
  - Ute Maschke says their students are returning to work and can't afford to give up work to attend training. However, she is seeing more flexibility from employers to accommodate training schedules than ever before in her experience.
    - If there was a way to help them pay their bills while they are training (learn and earn), she believes enrollment would go up.
      - Nora Kenney says they had a summer career program for formerly incarcerated students that offered a small stipend (\$75/week), and that was fairly successful.
      - Kelly Henwood = Something about ITAs that I didn't understand?
  - Kelly Henwood, SDCCE = Hesitancy across the board for students to return to in-person classes, even in low-level ESL classes.
  - Stacey Adame = They surveyed their students, and 80% did not want to return to face-to-face. The one class that did want to return to in-person shut down in three days due to COVID outbreak.
  - Greg Hill comments that people don't want to return to campuses or offices. Most people want to be able to work and learn remotely.
  - Nora Kenney comments that students have gone through so much trauma and loss that they don't have the ability to complete full terms. They have needed more behavioral health services.
- Kelly asks if any noncredit institution present offers internship courses.
  - Kim Bellaart answers that K-12 AE does. They have teachers visit the internship sites periodically.
- Since enrollment is down across the state, Liz inquires whether there is any conversation at the state level concerning funding and outcomes. Stacey Adame replies that there has been no mention at the meetings she has attended.
